# BACKGROUND

Tender OPS2019-12 was released to request bids for approximately 40,000 linear meters of hot rubberized crack sealing for use on various asphalt paved surfaces within the Municipality. The sealant material is MTO approved for all district use (acceptable for use in Northern and Southern Ontario).

Annual sealing of cracks in asphalt pavement reduces the impact of freeze/thaw cycles and helps preserve municipal roadways.

This work was completed in 2018 by Northern Contracting & Maintenance Limited at a price of \$1.55 per meter applied.

The tender was advertised on the City of Elliot Lake website and through the Merx website. Only one firm responded to the tender.

# **ANALYSIS**

The pricing received through the tender responses was as follows:

o Northern Contracting and Maintenance Limited - \$1.80 per meter totalling \$72,000.00

No bid irregularities were noted during the tender review process.

# **FINANCIAL IMPACT**

There was a total of \$65,000. Odesignated for Asphalt pavement crack sealing in the 2019 road maintenance budget. Total amount for the work, inclusive of applicable taxes is \$62,000. Council would need to approve the additional cost of \$7,000 from the Public Works Reserve that has a balance of \$475,000.

# LINKS TO STRATEGIC PLAN

Approval of this request will uphold the commitment of Mayor and Council toward "Continued Investment into Infrastructure". This report serves to assist in "educating the public on infrastructure operations, repair and replacement".

# **SUMMARY**

It is recommended that the amended submission received from Northern Contracting Ltd., in the amount \$72,000.00 plus applicable taxes for Asphalt pavement crack sealing services be accepted.

# **BACKGROUND**

The IT Department relies on a vehicle to travel throughout the City to perform tasks involved with the job. Since majority of the work involved requires transporting computer equipment, a van is the most practical source of transportation. This vehicle is also utilized by other departments when sending staff out of town for conferences and training, making the 7 passenger capability a must feature.

For the 2019 year, the department budgeted for (1) vehicle to be purchased as part of our ongoing fleet management program. The proposed unit is intended to replace the current 2007 unit which is well past its duty cycle.

The tender was advertised on the City of Elliot Lake website with (1) local firm expressing interest.

# **ANALYSIS**

Bidders for this contract were requested to submit complete pricing for the work as outlined in Section IV of the tender document.

One local firm submitted a bid. Pricing was received as noted below:

Algoma Chrysler - \$32,994.<sup>00</sup> exclusive of taxes;

No bid irregularities or deviations from the procurement policy were noted during the evaluation of the tender packages.

# FINANCIAL IMPACT

This expenditure of \$32,994 plus applicable taxes is within the 2019 budgeted amount of \$36,600.

# LINKS TO STRATEGIC PLAN

These vehicles are critical tools in the delivery of necessary services consistent with Goal 9 of the Strategic Plan, which states that we will "maximize opportunities for intra-municipal mobility through the continued maintenance and further improvement and development of municipal infrastructure."

# **SUMMARY**

Approving the recommendations presented in this report will assist in the maintenance of reliable fleet service vehicles for use in the ongoing operation and maintenance of our City infrastructure.

Re: Speed Bumps on Nordic Mine Road for Golf Cart Crossing



Several years ago after the completion of the City's Stone Ridge Golf Course, a decision was made by The City and Retirement Living (Manage Golf Course) to install seasonal (May-October) speed bumps on Nordic Mine Road between golf course holes 3 to 4 and 6 to 7, where they cross the road. The City also installed stop signs that require traffic in both directions to stop at both crossings.

Nordic Mine Road receives traffic mainly from people travelling to the golf course and seasonal campers travelling east of the golf course as well as Denison Mine lime trucks that travel in and out three times a week to mine site restoration areas.

Denison environmental has stated Health and Safety Concerns

- Driving over the speed bumps is physically hard on the driver, increasing risk of injury which has recently
  occurred with a driver reporting a WSIB injury claim directly resulting from the speed bumps on Nordic
  Mine Road.
- Causes unnecessary wear and tear on the tanker trucks cracking of tanker walls, premature failure of leveling equipment, suspension systems, shock absorbers, tires, brakes and dashboards.
- Bolts to install speed bumps frequently come loose and stick up become a hazard for any vehicle that must travel over the speed bumps.

Denison Environmental believes as a public road, the interest to all using it should be considered – and that the golfers that cross it, should do so with care and attention. Likewise, drivers on the road have a responsibility to drive with care and obey appropriate signage.

A meeting was held earlier in the year between Denison Environmental, Retirement Living and the City to come up with solutions that would satisfy all parties. The City was looking to reduce the speed limit on the road which is currently not posted (making it 50km zone) to a 30 km road, adding stop signs to both golf cart paths, brushing the corner roads for better visibility and removing the speed bumps and painting in crosswalk lines. These changes seem to satisfy all parties, although Retirement Living requested a letter from the City that by removing the speed bumps, The City would assume all liability. This prompted a call to the City's Insurance broker, who strongly advised from removing the current speed bumps, stating any future accidents would be investigated – especially pertaining to any current changes. This information was shared with all parties and the current speed bumps remain in place.

# **ARTICLE II**

The Contractor undertakes and agrees:

The Contractor and the Owner for themselves, their successors, and assigns, hereby undertake and agree to the full performance of the covenant contained herein and in the General Conditions of the Contract, and that this Agreement with the General Conditions of the Contract, and the Specifications constitute the Contract and the Plans.

# **ARTICLE V**

The Contractor agrees to carry out this Agreement in a manner calculated to avoid additional expenses and additional legal costs being incurred by the Owner and undertakes to indemnify the Owner for all such additional legal expenses and any legal costs arising from the carrying out of this Agreement including, without limited the generality of the foregoing, the Contractor agrees to indemnify the Owner for all legal expenses and legal costs that the Owner may be compelled to pay in respect of any Lien claim or claims which may be claimed or registered.

The terms "Owner", and "City" and "Corporation" as mentioned in the Agreement, the Information for Bidders, the Tender, the General Conditions and the Special Conditions of the Contract, and Specifications, shall mean "The Corporation of the City of Elliot Lake."
