**Title:** Bag Tag Fee Options for 2020

**Objective:** To provide options in regards to the Bag Tag Fee and the impact that it would have on the tax levy for the 2020 Budget.

**Background:** The City went out to tender earlier in the year for recycling and organics processing as well the collection of recyclables, waste, organics and yard waste. Bluewater Recycling Association Material Recovery Facility (MRF) was the selected destination for receiving the recyclables. The City has entered into an agreement with Bluewater Recycling for a seven year term. As noted at the time of the award, there was a significant increase to the cost of processing recyclables.

Canadian Waste Management Inc. was awarded a seven year contract for the collection of waste, recyclables, leaf and yard waste and to begin a curbside organics collection program. The processing of the organics is to be done by StormFisher Environmental.

**Analysis:** The 2019 purchase price for a bag tag is \$2.60. The revenue received from the bag tag covers the cost for the yard waste collection, weekly garbage collection, bi-weekly recycling collection and processing. With the introduction of the organics program, the increased cost for the collection contract and the processing of recyclables additional revenue of approximately \$760,200, for a total of \$1,574,000 will be required in 2020.

On average the City sells about 313,000 bag tags per year. The introduction of the organics program could result in reduction in bag tag sales of up to 30%. Accordingly, if the City were to put all the costs onto the bag tag fee for the services it would be approximately \$7.20. This is a significant increase and would likely result in garbage being dumped on the roadside, and into garbage containers at City and private facilities.

**Financial Impact:** The following chart illustrates the impact on the tax levy required based on bag tag fee options:

Bag Tag Fee	Impact on Tax Base
\$2.60	\$1,012,566 (1.71%)
\$3.00	\$924,880 (1.56%)
\$3.50	\$815,160 (1.38%)
\$4.00	\$705,440 (1.19%)
\$4.50	\$595,720 (1.01%)
\$5.00	\$486,000 (0.82%)
