

Town of Penetanguishene Sites

1 Main Street (Town Dock) - HMS Badger, Historical Replica Gunboat Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 10 am to 4 pm



HMS Badger is a replica 1812 British Gunboat fashion after vessels common in Nelson's navy during the Golden Age of sail. Authentically rigged as a naval cutter, the Badger flies up to seven sails. *Note: This site is weather dependant.*

13 Burke Street—Penetanguishene Centennial Museum and Archives Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 10 am to 4 pm



The history of one of Canada's oldest communities is proudly displayed at Museum and Archives, housed in a lumber office and general store built in 1875 by lumber baron and former mayor Charles Beck. Learn the importance of the logging industry to the Town's beginnings.

500 Church Street— Waypoint Centre for Mental Health Care and Administration Building Saturday only 10 am to 4 pm



The Administration building which opened as a boy's reformatory in the 1860's and the former Chaplain's residence known as The Elms will also be open to the public on this weekend.

215 Church Street—St. James on the Lines Anglican Church Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 12 pm to 4 pm



This church was constructed in 1836 on the "lines of communication", the roads between Forts York and Penetanguishene. The unusual church aisle was built wide enough for soldiers to march four abreast.

33 Robert Street West—J.T. Payette House Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 10 am to 2 pm



This magnificent two-storey home built about 1918, is unique and of local style. This home was built for J.T. Payette, owner of a thriving local foundry and Mayor of Penetanguishene from 1921 to 1925.

55 Farlain Lake Road West Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 10 am to 2 pm



An example of a log cabin, this building has recently undergone restoration and includes original features such as local stone work, cedar logs and sunroom ceiling boards. The blueprint is

Township of Springwater Sites

2648 Crossland Road, Elmvale—Crossland General Store

Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 10 am to 4 pm



The original frame structure was built in the 1870's by early settler Harry Crossland as his family home. A general store, known for years as "The People's Store" operated in this building from 1974 to 1974.

2552 Penetanguishene Road, Hillsdale — Hillsdale Lockup

Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 10 am to 4 pm



The three-cell Hillsdale Lock-up was constructed in 1906 when Hillsdale was designated as a "police village". The lock-up is considered the smallest jail and courthouse currently standing in Ontario.

2942 Crossland Road, Elmvale—Flos Presbyterian Church

Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 9:45 am to 4 pm



Knox Presbyterian Church held its first dedication service on December 19, 1909. It contains original stained glass windows and furnishings, including pews, pulpit, chairs and an ash communion table.

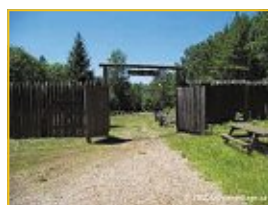
Penetanguishene Trail—North of Hillsdale on west side of Penetanguishene Road (Highways 93) at the bend, south of Flos Road 7 East, north of Robert Boulevard, Hillsdale

Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 10 am to 4



Originally constructed as a military supply route during the War of 1812. This road played an important role in the settlement of northern Simcoe County.

2714 Grenfell Road, Minesing—Historic Fort Willow Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 10 am to 4 pm



Fort Willow was a trade depot for fur and operated in conjunction with the Nine Mile Portage. During the War of 1812, Fort Willow was used for communications and supplies for the military.

7 John Street, Elmvale Royal Canadian Legion—Branch 262

Saturday 10 am to 4 pm and Sunday 10 am to 4 pm



The Legion Branch 262 in Elmvale was established in 1934 and this year will mark 80 years of service. Tour this community hub and view the War Museum they proudly dis-
