1. Call to Order

Chair Slack called the Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

1.1 New Member Welcome & Roundtable Introductions

Nicholas Trevisan and Prathibha Mathews were welcomed to the Committee as Members. Roundtable introductions were made.

3. Approval of Minutes

4. Presentation/Discussion

4.1 Ajax Waterfront Update

Dave Meredith, Director of Operations and Environmental Services, presented an overview of a new management and by-law enforcement strategy for the Ajax Waterfront. Several issues were identified, including on-street parking, informal gatherings, waste management and litter, conflicts with permit holders, and damaged infrastructure. The strategy is noted to be a joint effort between Operations & Environmental Services, Recreation & Culture and By-law Services. D. Meredith discussed many elements of the strategy to mitigate and eliminate the issues including:

- Updates to the Parks By-law
- On-street parking restrictions
- An active transportation communication strategy
- Permitted picnic locations
- A review of transportation demand management
- Dedicated resources reserved for permit holders
- Introduction of new waste and recycling stations

Members posed questions relative to whether the strategy will focus solely on Rotary Park. D. Meredith noted Rotary Park as the primary focal point, however in the future staff may review Carruthers Marsh and Paradise Park. The Committee sought clarification regarding on-street parking restrictions and the effect on residents. Additional questions related to charcoal disposal, waste management and concerns for the public invading natural wildlife habitats.

4.2 Lakeview Boulevard Improvements EA – Community Working Group

Carol Coleman, provided an overview of the Lakeview Boulevard Improvements Environmental Assessment, which will review options for possible realignment of the road in the Paradise Park neighbourhood. As changes and construction along the Ajax waterfront are sensitive matters, staff are looking to conduct increased public consultation efforts. C. Coleman noted that a Community Working Group is being established, comprised of residents in the study area, residents outside of the study area and representatives from some of the Town's advisory committees. A representative from the Committee was sought to participate. The Community Working Group will meet approximately four times throughout the duration of the study, and there will be an additional two public consultation meetings. Several Members expressed interest in participating, therefore those interested were asked to complete an online application by April 17, 2016.

4.3 Provincial EAC Symposium

J. Schofield presented and reviewed the final draft agenda for the Provincial EAC Symposium event on May 14, 2016. She provided details of several guest speakers and presenters. Members who will be attending the event were reminded to complete online registration. She encouraged the Committee to brainstorm ideas for the workshop component and prepare for further discussion at the May 5, 2016 Meeting.

The event will take place rain or shine. The next litter picks will be held on Saturday, July 16, and Saturday, October 15, 2016.

6. Update from Council

Councillor Dies shared information with the Committee relative to the Ajax-Pickering Board of Trade's recent support for development of a Pickering airport. She briefly discussed the matter of the Pickering airport lands and encouraged Members to read more about the matter by visiting www.landoverlandings.com. Councillor Dies informed the Committee that the town had received correspondence from Minister of the Environment, Glenn Murray, regarding the Duffins Creek Water Pollution Control Plant issue, noting that further study is required. She thanked all of those who submitted Part II order requests as they contributed to the Minister's decision. Or the interest of the Committee, Councillor Dies mentioned a forthcoming presentation to Council on April 18, on behalf of the Rouge Valley Health System regarding possible amalgamation.

7. Standing Items

7.1 Work Plan

J. Schofield provide a brief update on the 'Bring Back the Salmon' initiative. She noted that the salmon will be released into Duffins Creek in a few weeks. N. Burnett inquired on the status of an update from the Regional Waste Management section.

7.2 Durham Environmental Advisory Committee Update

K. Sellers provided a summary of presentation and discussion topics from the recent DEAC meeting. The DEAC received a presentation on <u>Durham Partners in Project Green</u> and discussed the nominations received for the DEAC Environmental Achievement Awards.

8. New Business

Councillor Dies informed the Committee that the removal of the woodlot at Rossland Road and Harwood Avenue had commenced. Members inquired whether the trees that had been removed along Kingston Road will be replaced. J. Schofield noted that the trees had been removed by the Region of Durham and will not be replaced. Members noted concern for this matter and requested additional time for discussion at the next Meeting.
