1. Call to Order

Chair Ramnauth called the meeting to order at 6:10 p.m. With consent of all Members present, the Meeting proceeded without quorum.

2. Disclosure of Conflict of Interest

3. Approval of Minutes

This Item was deferred until quorum was met.

Presentation/Discussion 4.

4.1 **Inclusion Services**

Victoria Schaffer, Community Recreation Coordinator, introduced the Committee to the Inclusion Services section of the Recreation & Culture department. Inclusion services strives to provide equitable levels of service and access to recreational programming so that everyone can participate regardless of ability level. Inclusion services includes adapting to

various abilities including physical, behavioral, developmental, visual, hearing, and medical needs. Inclusion support offers free, one-to-one staff support for participation between the ages of 2-21 years old with special needs. Participants must be Ajax residents and registered for a Camp or Seasonal Recreation Program. V. Schaffer discussed the role of an Inclusion Counsellor, noting they support the child or youth to be fully included in the program and oversee toileting, feeding, behavior management, adaptive programming and social development. An overview of the extensive training staff receive was provided, which includes, non-violent crisis intervention and prevention, lifts and transfers, behavior management, policies and procedures, as well as LGBTQ+/Transition training.

Councillor Ashby entered the Meeting and quorum was established (6:30 p.m.).

It was noted that the Aquatics section provides a free, accessible swim time from 4-5 p.m. at the Audley Recreation Centre on Saturdays. Additionally, private special needs swim lessons are available for the price of group lessons at all recreation facilities. The Town provides various equipment loans including a TerraTrek wheelchair, ice sledge and water wheelchairs are available at the Audley and McLean Centre pools. V. Shaffer discussed community partnerships with Grandview Kids and Special Olympics Ontario to provide special needs-only programming.

Members posed questions relative to the engagement with Inclusion Services and awareness of such supports. Funding and fees were discussed. V. Shaffer provided examples of adaptive programming so that activities are suitable to everyone in the group. She encouraged Members to help spread the word about the availability of Inclusion Services. Members present requested that a copy of the presentation be circulated with the Minutes.

4.3 Terminology Review

- S. Joseph discussed the importance of understanding the value of terminology as it enables people to communicate clearly and without the need for lengthy explanations. Detailed definitions and examples for several terms were discussed:

 - Gay
 - Bisexual
 - Transgender
 - Two-spirited
 - Queer
 - Questioning
 - Intersex

- Ally
- Pansexual
- Gender identity
- Gender expression
- Gender transition
- Cisgender

S. Joseph provided clarification on the difference between sex, sexual attraction, gender identity and gender expression. Members discussed the increased prevalence of such terms in society, and inquired whether individuals are born or cultured into their identities. S. Joseph emphasized that it is not about agreeing with an individual's lifestyle, but about awareness and understanding of such. Councillor Ashby and Regional Councillor Jordan were asked if

they had experienced any concerns from residents based on gender discrimination. No complaints were noted. Members expressed interest in a continuation session relative to terminology relating to diversity (race, ethnicity, etc.). Members presented requested a copy of the presentation be circulated with the Minutes.

Councillor Jordan shared details and several slides from her recent visit to the <u>Canadian Museum for Human Rights</u> in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

She noted that during her attendance at the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Conference that participants passed a motion to recognize September 30th as Orange Shirt Day in honour of residential school survivors.
