1. Call to Order

Chair Tyler Morin called the meeting to order (6:00 p.m.) Karina Marino was introduced as a Recreation and Culture placement student from Centennial College.

4. Presentation/Discussion

4.1 Nature Deficit Disorder – Barriers to / Benefits from Outdoor Programming

N. Smith entered the Meeting (6:10 p.m.)

K. Marino introduced her presentation on Nature Deficit Disorder by screening a video to explain the issue. Nature Deficit Disorder is loss of one's connection to nature. She discussed the negative effects on adults, youth and children, which include behavioral problems. Causes of the Deficit are attributed to factors such as dependency on TV, video games, and parental fears of "stranger danger". K. Marino reviewed statistics from the Centre for Reconnecting with Nature, noting that 70% children are vitamin D deficient and that 50% of preschoolers do not receive the required amount of outdoor playtime. Benefits to connecting with nature and the outdoors help to stimulate one's creativity and decrease anxiety. The need for urban planners, schools, libraries and other community agents to plan for accessible outdoor spaces for play and programming was identified as a contributing factor for improvement.

J. Wood reviewed current outdoor Recreation and Culture programming which included details on the seasonal adventure programs at Greenwood Conservation Area, as well as summer camps at the waterfront, Greenwood and Paulynn Park. She noted the Town's focus on expanding outdoor pre-school programming and identified barriers to programming, such as parents' requests to not have their child outside all day. There exist many parental misconceptions about outdoor programming, including concerns for inclement weather and sun safety. Suggestions were sought from the Committee to help alleviate and educate about such misconceptions.

Members posed questions relative to how such information is currently shared with parents (parent handbook). It was encouraged that the town partner with local health care professionals and physicians to promote the messaging around Nature Deficit Disorder. The messaging could also be carried through organized sports associations, schools and community/cultural groups. Members inquired how summer camp programming was structured in terms of duration (week-long) and suggested that there be a one-day trial option to register for like an Open House. It was also proposed that a week be dedicated to a different camp showcase each day. Additional suggestions shared included creation of an infographic to help explain the misconceptions, social media testimonials from parents, Did You Know...? Mythbusting advertisements, expanded outdoor activities that include bocce ball, and Amazing Race Ajax event. Programming Open House days for the outdoor camps could also allow parents to accompany the child to learn more about the program.

4.2 Youth Week 2016

A. Galea, Community Recreation Coordinator, presented an overview of Youth Week recognition in the Town of Ajax. Youth Week will be recognized this year from May 1-7, 2016. On Thursday, May 5, the Town will host its annual Encourage Me Ajax Event, where youth ambassadors will be recognized, youth will be celebrated and Spider Jones will be speaking as a keynote presenter. Informational booths and displays at the event will include DRPS, YMCA, Youth Centre as well as local universities and colleges. A. Galea provided details of the application process for youth to apply to be Encourage Me Ajax Ambassadors, noting the opportunity is open to those 13-19 years of age who submit a 150 word or less submission online at www.ajaxyouth.ca.

H. Hoskins, Youth Engagement Advisory Committee Member, reviewed events and programming scheduled to date to take place throughout Youth Week. All programming was

noted to be free. Activities will include drop in sports games, comic book giveaway day, Zumba workshop, cooking and baking, and a movie night at St. Francis.

A. Galea and H. Hoskins sought feedback from the Committee on additional information booths for the Encourage Me Ajax event, as well as for Youth Week activities that appeal to all interests of youth, not just sports. Suggestions for additional information booths included youth employment connections, anti-bullying groups and community volunteer opportunities to assist with completing the required 40 hours of community service. Game night and opportunities to host a Chess tournament and tutorial were also suggested as possible Youth Week activities. Additional suggestions were welcomed by email. The Committee was invited to attend the Encourage Me Ajax event.

6. Update from Council

Regional Councillor Collier provided an update on the Regional Council Composition Review. He informed the Committee that Regional Council had approved reallocation of two Oshawa Regional Councillors, to Ajax and Whitby (one each). This change will maintain the current size of 28 members plus the Regional Chair. Regional Council also passed a motion to have the composition reviewed every nine years. This approval was the first of three required for the triple majority. The change in composition also requires approval of the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, and is anticipated to come into effect before the 2018 municipal election. Such changes would also require a ward boundary review for the Town. Members congratulated Council on their dedication to pursue the composition issue.

7. Standing Items

7.1 Work Plan

This item was not discussed in detail. J. wood encouraged members to bring forward suggestions for action and discussion items.

7.2 Recreation & Culture Departmental Update

J. Wood circulated promotional materials for upcoming events, including March Break programs and a copy of the Spring/Summer Recreation & Parks Program Guide. Information on the Community Volunteer Opportunity Application was introduced to allow community and cultural groups to submit volunteer opportunities through the Town's Volunteer Portal.

1. Call to Order

Chair Tyler Morin called the meeting to order (6:00 p.m.) With consent of those Members present, the Meeting proceeded without quorum.

6. Update from Council

Regional Councillor Collier provided a summary of the Volunteer Recognition Awards ceremony, noting the calibre of amazing volunteerism within the community. Civic award winners were identified as Abira Navindran (youth) and Sepelene Deonarine (adult). Regional Councillor Collier noted that the General Government Committee had recently approved the tender design contract for the Audley Recreation Centre Phase 2. He noted that he would provide details of public consultation opportunities once available.

Regional Councillor Collier exited the Meeting (6:10 p.m.)

4. Presentation/Discussion

4.1 Lakeview Boulevard Improvements EA – Community Working Group

Carol Coleman, provided an overview of the Lakeview Boulevard Improvements Environmental Assessment, which will review options for possible realignment of the road in the Paradise Park neighbourhood. As changes and construction along the Ajax waterfront are sensitive matters, staff are looking to conduct increased public consultation efforts. C. Coleman noted that a Community Working Group is being established, comprised of residents in the study area, residents outside of the study area and representatives from some of the Town's advisory committees. A representative from the Committee was sought to participate. The Community Working Group will meet approximately four times throughout the duration of the study, and there will be an additional two public consultation meetings. Several Members expressed interest in participating, therefore those interested were asked to complete an online application.

4.2 Diversity Conference 2016

S. Joseph presented an update on the progress of transitioning to phase 2 of the Town's DACE Plan. S. Joseph informed the Committee that one of the action items from the Plan was to host a Diversity Conference. He noted that the Town will be hosting its first Diversity Conference in the fall of 2016. The free event will be held in the HMS Room at the Ajax Community Centre. From 9 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. A proposed theme of "Embracing Diversity; Engaging Community" was introduced to Members for feedback. The conference will be used to launch the updated DACE Plan, and will include a keynote speaker and breakout sessions. S. Joseph reviewed prospective ideas for breakout workshops and sought the Committee's feedback on topics for discussion. He noted that a survey will be circulated to gain feedback from advisory committee Members and community groups as to the date and subject matter for the conference.

J. de Mel entered the Meeting, H. Naim exited the Meeting (6:40 p.m.)

Members posed questions relative to sponsorship opportunities, target audience, and topics, whether the conference will be free. It was suggested that the Conference be streamed or taped to increase access. It was proposed that workshop topics be divided into streams (beginner/advanced) to help facilitate discussion.
