### **EVENTS & PROGRAMS**

### Coffee House at the CC – October 2016 & January 2017

The Coffee House at the CC continues to sell out for every performance with a waiting list of people who want to attend. There are regulars, however, also a good turnover of new people coming out too. This popular event continues to draw very gifted local artists and showcases a good variety of different genres. Coffee Houses scheduled will be February, March, May and October.

### Community Christmas Concert

This past event we implemented a change to the event in that there is now a \$5 charge for tickets. In the past this has been a free event with people bringing a can of food for the Food Bank. However, when tickets are free, there are noshows and this is frustrating for people who have wanted to attend and could not get a ticket. Adding a value to the event not only helps to address this challenge, but it also allows us to cover all costs and be able to make a cash donation to the Food Bank in addition to food donations. This year we raised \$400 in cash and almost \$300 in canned food donations, for a total of \$700. The artists showcased were very well received and the feedback from the public was very positive.

### • NEW PROJECT! Digital Creator North

In working with Near North Media Lab in North Bay, Elliot Lake was selected as one of six communities in Northern Ontario to be a part of an innovative and exciting project for youth.

The Digital Creator project will establish low-barrier media arts based creator spaces for youth (ages 14-19) in six partner communities across Northern Ontario. These spaces will operate as drop-in, out-of-school learning environments for youth to develop skills in digital media using a participatory culture model. These spaces will inspire creative experimentation, peer networking/collaboration, civic engagement, and hands-on learning using various media arts disciplines. These disciplines include video production, audio recording, animation, 3D printing, graphic design, and coding/programming. This project is aimed to have a positive cultural impact on the community of Elliot

Lake and surrounding area by increasing participation of youth in digital media creation.

A full time position will be created for a Program Leader at no cost to The City of Elliot Lake. The position will be for a period of 14 months and is funding, in part, by Trillium. Under the supervision of the Program Coordinator and the Coordinator of Arts & Culture at the City of Elliot Lake, the Digital Creator Program Lead will be responsible for coordinating and executing the Digital Creator North project in Elliot Lake. The project will be based out of the Lester B. Pearson Civic Centre and will begin in March.

### **Benefits of the Project:**

- Is a sustainable project.
- Removes some of the stigma of isolation in a Northern Community through technology.
- This type of specialized program would not ordinarily be available to our youth.
- Creates an interest for our youth in considering post-secondary education in the field of digital media arts/technology.
- Instills pride in our community from the perspective of youth, whereby a deliverable is potentially the promotion of Elliot Lake through the eyes of our youth.

Only other 5 Northern Ontario communities selected are:

- o Sault Ste. Marie
- Soo Lookout
- Timmins
- Temiskaming
- o Kenora

### • Civic Centre Activity

We are seeing an increase in bookings at the Civic Centre for 2017. Many weekends are already booked for events and concerts. So far we have a total of 27 theatre events booked and in addition other events booked in meeting rooms and lobby space in the building.

### Family Show

In celebration of Canada's 150<sup>th</sup>, we will present a family show, March 11 at the theatre entitled Brent & Sarah's Comedy Magic Show. Tickets will be \$40 for a family of 4 or \$15 Adults and \$9 children. This show has been presented often on Disney cruises.

### Winterfest & Uranium Heritage Days

Cultural activities will be included in both festivals including ice sculptures, snow canvas mountain, concerts, and more. Planning and coordination is ongoing.
