

1. Call to Order

Co-Chair De Mel called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

4. Presentations/Discussion Items

4.1 Youth Engagement Advisory Committee Update

Robert Prochilo introduced Ms. Alisha D'Mello, Youth Engagement Advisory Committee Member, who provided an overview of recent YEAC events and accomplishments. She shared updates on youth spaces, afterschool programs, and Youth Week and Encourage Me Ajax events. An achievement of this term was noted as increased communications and social media presence for the YEAC. Ms. D'Mello thanked the Committee and staff for their support of YEAC initiatives throughout the year.

Members posed questions relative to voting outreach for youth, and youth-senior support programming. Mr. Prochilo shared information relative to the "Take the Lead" youth funding program coordinated in partnership with The Youth Centre.

4.2 Preschool Programs

Amanda Bedwell, Community Recreation Coordinator, presented the results of the preschool programming survey previously discussed with the Committee. She noted that the survey revealed 85% of families with multiply children accessing preschool programming have only one child enrolled. It was identified the 97% of participants indicated satisfaction with current programming. Ms. Bedwell discussed plans to rename the section to **Preschool and Kindergarten** programming and add new active play based learning classes. She shared a <u>video</u> in respect to 'physical literacy' and identified her interest in incorporating it into programming. She reviewed plans for circulation of a Preschool and Kindergarten program flyer in the fall and noted plans to review opportunities for programming of 0-3 year olds at the same time and location as 'Ready, Set…Learn' and "Kinderstart' classes, in order to encourage enrollment of multiple children in concurrent programs.

4.3 2014 Customer Polling Results

David Forget, Manager, Quality Service & Special Projects, delivered a presentation highlighting some of the key findings of the customer polling, noting that Ajax residents are generally satisfied with their government and services, however there is an increased perception of barriers to accessing programs and services. Mr. Forget confirmed that the sample group was statistically considered to be a representative sample, comprised of 600 respondents balanced through all four wards. Discussion related to full demographical breakdown of results and whether comparative surveys are conducted in Pickering and Whitby. The complete report of results is available on the Town's website.

5. Standing Items

5.1 Updated Work Plan

Ms. Moore solicited feedback from Members relative to any work plan items that were not completely addressed throughout the term, as well as items of interest to carry forward to the new term work plan. The Committee expressed interest in taking a more 'active' role in assisting with Town events/initiatives in addition to its advisory role. Members reinforced the importance of staff to bring items to the Committee <u>prior</u> to completion, so that feedback

and consultation can be considered. Consideration for more cross-committee consultation/collaboration was encouraged.

5.2 Recreation & Culture Departmental Update

Ms. Wood provided details of several upcoming events in Recreation & Culture, including the youth skateboard competition, Silver Screen Sunday event, Trailfest, Canada Day celebration, and the Pan Am 2015 one-year countdown Viva La Noche event.

5.3 Pan Am 2015 Local Host Committee

Ms. Moore updated the committee in respect to the recently launched Pan Am Ajax website, song competition winner and one-year countdown event.

Councillor Crawford provided updates on several Council items of business including funding for Paradise Park sand dune restoration, road closures anticipated for the realignment of Rossland Road project, Highway 407 extension, widening of Highway 401, City of Pickering 'Durham Live' development application, Veridian Board composition and the Town of Ajax Community Action Plan Report.
