

# Priority Area 1: Create a culture of inclusion

## Highlights

- Town of Ajax is the first local Municipality to become one of the LDIPC-sponsored Diversity and Immigration Champion program.
- The Town of Whitby Ethno-cultural and Diversity Advisory Committee (EDAC) has created a set of inclusive language guidelines that will be used in staff training.
- The Pickering Public Library has new board recruitment kit that includes diversity competencies for the 2014/2015 recruitment for Library Board Trustees.
- Durham PFLAG has been working with Regional and Municipal Councils for a number of years, raising awareness of LGBTQ issues and challenging Councillors to think differently.

## Highlights

- The Ajax Pickering Board of Trade sees the value in engaging with the diverse communities within their area and have recently established a diversity committee.
- All of the business associations interviewed provided explicit training and resources related to the AODA for their members.
- All of the Chambers and Boards of Trade polled for the Report Card expressed an interest in learning more about the new federal Express Entry model for new immigrants.



# Priority Area 3: Attract and retain newcomers

## **Highlights**

- The Town of Whitby includes a "new to Whitby" section of their website with links to the Durham Immigration Portal as well as a business resource guide and handbook for foreign workers.
- Work is underway to tell potential investors and residents about the benefits of living and doing business in Durham region. While 10 formal delegations in 2012 and another 9 in 2013 were recorded, exchanges, visits and informal delegations contribute to the overall effort to market Durham internationally.
- The City of Pickering created a guide to how the budget is created online and initiated a great new program called "Pickering Pros", an online program that highlights City staff and officials and offers real-time Q&A on Facebook and Twitter.


## **Highlights**



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



#### What You Need to Know

- · A higher rate of self-rated health is better for health.
- The percentage of adults who rate their health as excellent or very good ranges by Health Neighbourhood from 37% to 69%.
- Self-rated health status has been found to be a strong predictor of well-geing. Self-rated health tends to be lower in the downtown areas of the urban municipalities. Five Neighbourhoods in Oshawa and one in Clarington have significantly lower self-rated health than Durham Region. Neighbourhoods with high self-rated health are scattered throughout the Region.

#### Indicator Notes

- This indicator measures the percentage of adults aged 18 years or older who rate their health as excellent or very good.
- Source: Durham data Rapid Risk Factor Surveillance System (RRFSS), Durham Region Health Department and Institute for Social Research, York University, 2009-2013. Ontaino data - Rapid Risk Factor Surveillance System (RRFSS) Provincial Sample Pilot Project, 2011.
- RRFSS is an ongoing survey of adults in Durham Region that collects data related to health knowledge, attitudes and behaviours. Five years of data were combined to provide a large enough sample for analysis at the Neighbourhood level. Respondents were asked to rate their health as excellent, very good, good, fair or poor. This indicator combined two categories.
- Neighbourhoods were sorted by the percentage of adults with excellent or very good self-rated health and divided into quintiles (five equal groupings). Approximately 10 Neighbourhoods are in each quintile.
- Neighbourhoods were compared with Durham Region based on their confidence intervals. Those
  with rates that were lower or higher had 16% confidence intervals that did not overlap with those of
  Durham Region and were significantly different.
