1. Call to Order

Mayor Parish called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. Disclosure of Pecuniary Interest

There were no disclosures of pecuniary interest.

3. Adoption of Minutes

Moved by: P. Brown Seconded by: C. Jordan

That the Minutes of the regular meeting of Council held on March 9 2015 be adopted.

Added item: Ward 2 Councillor Office

The Mayor made remarks in respect to Mr. Ashby's failure to comply with the financial filing requirements under the Municipal Elections leading to the forfeiture of his elected seat. It was noted that all candidates are required under the *Municipal Elections Act* to file a financial statement, and those whose expenses or contributions exceed \$10,000 must also file an auditor's report. As Mr. Ashby's campaign contributions and expenses exceeded \$10,000, both documents were required to be filed by the deadline. Mr. Ashby's submission did not include the required auditor's report.

WHEREAS Ward 2 Councillor Renrick Ashby has failed to file an auditor's report as required to be submitted with his candidate financial statement by the 2 PM, March 27, 2015, deadline established by the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996*; and

WHEREAS the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996*, provides that the penalty for failure of a candidate elected to office to file a required document is forfeiture of that office and that the office is deemed to be vacant; and,

WHEREAS the *Municipal Act, 2001*, requires that when an elected office has been forfeited and becomes vacant, that Council shall declare the office to be vacant at its next meeting;

BE IT RESOLVED that the office of Ward 2 Councillor be and is hereby declared vacant; and.

THAT the Clerk prepare a report for the April 13, 2015 meeting of Council to detail the requirements and alternatives available for filling the vacant office.

Mayor Parish noted that Mr. Ashby has the right to apply to the Ontario Superior Court of Justice for relief from the forfeiture of his office.

4. Delegation and Petitions/Public Hearings

4.1 Because I Am A Girl - Fitness Fundraiser Cheque Presentation to Plan Canada

Dawna Mensah and Sharon Service provided information on a Dance Fitness Fundraising event held in Ajax in February which raised nearly \$3000 for Plan Canada's Because I am a Girl initiative. Representatives from Plan Canada were in attendance and thanked Ms. Mensah and Ms. Service for their contributions to this event and accepted the cheque for funds raised.

4.2 Degree Designation or Certificate Recognition

Mayor Steve Parish recognised Carol Coleman and Vanessa Lorrain from the Engineering Section of the Planning & Development Department for recent academic achievements.

4.3 **Get Real Durham**

Kyle Chamberlain, Fire Prevention Officer presented in respect to a Durham-wide Fire Safety Campaign organized by the Durham Region Public Educators Committee which will run this Spring and again in the Fall. The specific campaign tactics were highlighted and opportunities to expand the program in the future were noted. It was clarified that while the focus of the campaign will be education-based, fire safety inspections will be conducted by Fire Services personnel going door-to-door upon request by occupants. In response to questions from members of Council, Mr. Chamberlain noted that leading causes of fires in residential homes include careless cooking, careless smoking, and unattended candles. Members thanked Mr. Chamberlain for his presentation.

4.4 Ajax Library Board Update

Phill White, Chair, Ajax Public Library Board, overviewed the Library Board Update as contained in the agenda package. Several topic areas were highlighted including advocacy efforts on behalf of the Ajax Library to obtain fair pricing on e-media, and upcoming Library events. Discussion took place surrounding e-media costs, and Mr. White provided additional information on various licensing models in this industry, and efforts by other libraries across North America to obtain fair and consistent pricing on products like e-books, audiobooks, videos, music, and other e-resources. Council directed Library staff to draft an Ajax-specific resolution in support of these advocacy efforts, and to bring it forward to the next Council meeting for Council's consideration.

4.5 **Bomb Girls**

Bob White, Ajax Resident, addressed Council in respect to the Bomb Girls Legacy Campaign, expressing concern that the term 'Bomb Girls' is an inaccurate historical representation of the women who worked at the D.I.L. Plant producing shells rather than bombs. Concerns were also expressed that certain town representatives had not provided sufficient response to his concerns as detailed in numerous letters on this matter.

Mayor Parish, Regional Councillor Jordan & Councillor Brown offered comments in response to Mr. White's submission, explaining that Council members and persons involved with the Bomb Girls Legacy Campaign acknowledge that the D.I.L. plant produced shells rather than bombs, but adopted the "Bomb Girls" tagline in order to capitalize on the success and popularity of a major T.V. series partially based on the history of the D.I.L. plant in Ajax. The importance of the fundraising campaign and the forthcoming monument to honor the D.I.L. women was emphasized.

That Council endorse the attached motion (ATT-1) regarding the restrictive practices of publishing companies relative to the sale of electronic content to public libraries.

BACKGROUND:

At the March 30th meeting of Council, Phill White, Chair of the Ajax Public Library Board, addressed the restrictive practices of major publishing companies with regard to the sale of electronic content to public libraries.

Mr. White also discussed the negative impact to customer service, and to the Library's budgets, that these restrictions continue to pose.

Mr. White also made reference to advocacy efforts taken by the Ajax Public Library Board, in conjunction with other Ontario libraries, to seek government intervention to help bring awareness of and resolution to the unreasonable practices employed by publishers.

DISCUSSION:

Subsequent to questions from Council and further discussion, the issue was referred to staff to develop a Motion to indicate the concerns of Council regarding the impact of publishers' practices and also illustrate its support for government intervention.

ATTACHMENT 1 – Proposed Resolution RE: Electronic Content Restrictions

WHEREAS the Town of Ajax and the Ajax Public Library are committed to providing equitable access to information and services regardless of format and given that customer demand for electronic content is increasing; and

WHEREAS Ajax Public Library staff are working with vendors to find mutually beneficial solutions so that public library customers have access to the wide range of electronic content that they have available to them in physical media; and

WHEREAS the specialized market terms for libraries provided by some publishers for the purchase of electronic content restrict the Ajax Public Library's ability to purchase these materials for public use, resulting in an inequity of access to electronic content, significant constraints on the Ajax Public Library budget, and an undermining of the Ajax Public Library's ability to fulfill its role;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Town of Ajax:

- 1. Request that the Department of Canadian Heritage and the Ontario Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport investigate publishers' restrictive practices in making downloadable electronic content available to public libraries, including the higher prices charged to public libraries; and
- 2. Request that staff bring the issues faced by libraries in obtaining access to electronic content to the attention of the Competition Bureau of Canada.

AND THAT a copy of this resolution be sent to the Honourable Michael Coteau, Minister of Tourism, Culture and Sport and to Mr. John Pecman, Commissioner of Competition for the Competition Bureau of Canada.

Health & Social Services

Regional Council endorsed the Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph Public Health motion to request that the Government of Ontario take action to reduce the consumption of high calorie, low nutrient beverages, and in particular energy drinks for children. The concern about rising usage of energy drinks is the sugar and caffeine content which can contribute to acute physical and mental health conditions.

The "No Time To Wait: Healthy Kids Strategy" (2013) made recommendations to:

- Ban the marketing of high calorie, low nutrient foods, beverages and snacks to children under the age of 12; and
- Ban point of sale promotions and displays of high calorie, low nutrient foods and beverages in retail settings, beginning with over sweetened beverages.

The Board urged the government to implement the recommendations of the strategy in a timely fashion, beginning with sugar sweetened beverages, particularly energy drinks for children.

Rent Geared to Income Housing

A report was received on the 2014 centralized waiting list statistics on rent geared to income assistance. At the end of 2014, there were 5,422 households requesting rent geared to income assistance, including 57 households requiring modified units for wheelchair accessibility. The majority of applicants on the list are families, but the number of single/non-senior applicants continues to grow due to the limited housing available for this cohort.

About 800 households on the waiting list will benefit from the Investment in Affordable Housing in Ontario which provides a temporary flat rate rent subsidy to offset costs for households paying more than 50% of their income on rent. This program runs until 2023/24.

Regional housing staff are working with other service managers to take advantage of recent legislative changes which allow some flexibility in how waiting lists are administered.

Finance

The Region received confirmation of its Triple A Credit Rating from Standard & Poors.

Planning & Economic Development Committee

Regional Council approved the engagement of the Toronto Region Conservation Authority to update the Carruther's Creek Watershed Plan on the Region's behalf at an estimated cost of \$1,089,500 over a four year period from 2015 to 2018, with funding not to exceed \$300,000 in 2015.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF AJAX

BY-LAW NUMBER 40-2015

A By-law to establish the 2015 tax rates for the Residential/Farm, Farmlands, Pipelines and Managed Forests property classes.

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Ajax has adopted a 2015 budget that includes the estimates of all sums required during the year for the purposes of the municipality pursuant to Section 290(1) of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O. 2001 as amended;

AND WHEREAS Section 312(2) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001* as amended, provides that for the purposes of raising the general local municipality levy, a local municipality shall, each year, pass a by-law levying a separate tax rate, as specified in the by-law, on the assessment in each property class in the local municipality rateable for local municipality purposes;

AND WHEREAS all property assessment rolls on which the 2015 taxes are to be levied have been returned and revised pursuant to the provisions of the *Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1990 c.A.31* as amended and its regulations;

AND WHEREAS Section 342(1)(b) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001* as amended states in part that a municipality may pass by-laws providing for alternative instalments and due dates to allow taxpayers to spread the payment of taxes more evenly over the year;

AND WHEREAS Section 345(2) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001* as amended, provides that a percentage charge, not to exceed 1 1/4 percent (1.25%)of the amount of taxes due and unpaid, may be imposed as a penalty for the non-payment of taxes on the first day of default or such later date as the by-law specifies;

AND WHEREAS Section 345(3) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001* as amended, provides that interest charges, not to exceed 1 1/4 percent (1.25%) each month of the amount of taxes due and unpaid, may be imposed for the non-payment of taxes in the manner specified in the by-law but interest may not start to accrue before the first day of default;

AND WHEREAS The Regional Municipality of Durham sets and levies the 2015 rates of taxation for Regional General Purposes, Regional Solid Waste Management Purposes, and Durham Region Transit Commission;

AND WHEREAS, By-law 100-2014 authorized, in part, a 2015 interim tax levy for the Town of Ajax before the adoption of estimates for the current year;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Ajax enacts as follows:

- 1. For the year 2015, the Corporation of the Town of Ajax shall levy upon the Property Classes set out in Schedule "A", the rates of taxation as set out in Schedule "A" attached to this by-law.
- 2. The total final taxes levied shall be reduced by the amount of the interim taxes levied.
- 3. Taxes shall become due and payable in two (2) instalments, as follows:

BY-LAW NUMBER 41-2015

A By-law to establish the 2015 tax rates for the Multi-Residential, Commercial, Parking Lot, Shopping Centres, Office Building, Industrial and Large Industrial, property classes.

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Ajax has adopted a 2015 budget that includes the estimates of all sums required during the year for the purposes of the municipality pursuant to Section 290(1) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001* as amended;

AND WHEREAS Section 312(2) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001* as amended, provides that for the purposes of raising the general local municipality levy, a local municipality shall, each year, pass a by-law levying a separate tax rate, as specified in the by-law, on the assessment in each property class in the local municipality rateable for local municipality purposes;

AND WHEREAS all property assessment rolls on which the 2015 taxes are to be levied have been returned and revised pursuant to the provisions of the *Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1990 c.A.31* as amended and its regulations;

AND WHEREAS Section 342(1)(b) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001* as amended states in part that a municipality may pass by-laws providing for alternative instalments and due dates to allow taxpayers to spread the payment of taxes more evenly over the year;

AND WHEREAS Section 345(2) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001* as amended, provides that a percentage charge, not to exceed 1 1/4 percent (1.25%) of the amount of taxes due and unpaid, may be imposed as a penalty for the non-payment of taxes on the first day of default or such later date as the by-law specifies;

AND WHEREAS Section 345(3) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001* as amended, provides that interest charges, not to exceed 1 1/4 percent (1.25%) each month of the amount of taxes due and unpaid, may be imposed for the non-payment of taxes in the manner specified in the by-law but interest may not start to accrue before the first day of default;

AND WHEREAS The Regional Municipality of Durham sets and levies the 2015 rates of taxation for Regional General Purposes, Regional Solid Waste Management Purposes, and Durham Region Transit Commission;

AND WHEREAS, By-law 100-2014 authorized, in part, a 2015 interim tax levy for the Town of Ajax before the adoption of estimates for the current year;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Ajax enacts as follows:

- 1. For the year 2015, the Corporation of the Town of Ajax shall levy upon the Property Classes set out in Schedule "A", the rates of taxation as set out in Schedule "A" attached to this by-law.
- 2. The total final taxes levied shall be reduced by the amount of the interim taxes levied
- 3. Taxes shall become due and payable in two (2) instalments, with the exact instalment dates to be established by the Director of Finance/Treasurer.
- 4. On application to the Town, a taxpayer may pay taxes by a pre-authorized payment plan. In the event of the default of payment on the pre-authorized payment plan, enrollment in the plan shall be terminated and the final tax levy shall be due and payable on the instalment dates as set out in section 3.
- 5. Any person may make payment of the taxes into a financial institution to the credit of the Treasurer, and the person making the payment shall be entitled to be issued a receipt by the institution for the amount paid.

- 6. In the event an instalment is not paid on its due date, there shall be imposed a penalty of 1 1/4 percent (1.25%) on the first day of the calendar month following non payment.
- 7. In the event an instalment is not paid on its due date, interest shall be imposed at the rate of 1 1/4 percent (1.25%) per month on the first day of the second calendar month following the due date and on the first day of every calendar month thereafter until the taxes are paid.
- 8. If any instalment remains unpaid at the due date, all future instalments become immediately due and payable.
- 9. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to accept part payment from time to time on account of taxes due, provided that the acceptance of any part payment shall not affect the collection of any percentage charge imposed under sections (6) and (7) of this by-law.
- 10. Notwithstanding the provisions of the by-law, all taxes shall be deemed to have been imposed and to be due on and from the first day of January 2015.
- 11. Nothing in this by-law shall prevent the Treasurer from proceeding at any time with the collection of any tax, or any part thereof, in accordance with the provisions of the statutes and by-laws governing the collection of taxes.






