Chair Harrison called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

4. Presentation/Discussion Items

4.1 2014 Customer Polling Results Summary

David Forget, Manager, Quality Service & Special Projects, delivered a presentation highlighting some of the key findings of the customer polling conducted in April 2014. He

noted that Ajax residents are generally satisfied with their government and Town staff; however there is an increased perception of barriers to accessing programs and services. Mr. Forget confirmed that the sample group was statistically considered to be a representative sample, comprised of 600 respondents balanced throughout all four wards.

Members requested that a copy of the full report and results be forwarded to the Committee. Discussion related to full demographical breakdown of results, how results correlate with the Town's view of its programs and services and census data, and the need to review wording of certain questions relative to race and ethnicity to make it more inclusive. Members also expressed interest in questioning relative to personal experiences with barriers instead of merely perception.

Councillor Ashby entered the Meeting (7:20 p.m.)

5. Standing Items

5.1 Updated Work Plan

Mr. Forget noted items that will carry forward to the new term including the HR Services hiring practices and applicant tracking initiatives, and creation of a volunteer management database.

7. Update from Council

Regional Councillor Jordan provided updates relative to several Council items. Details were shared relative to the <u>Community Action Plan Status Report</u> and the Duffin Creek Water Pollution Control Plant matter. Information on the Pan Am 2015 One-year Countdown event Viva La Noche Ajax! and the Region of Durham CUPE strike were shared. Regional Councillor Jordan discussed her attendance at the recent Great Lakes & St. Lawrence Cities Conference and encouraged Members to stop utilizing products with micro beads/micro plastics noting their negative impact on fish.

Councillor Ashby informed the Committee that Councillors have received an increased number of concerns regarding Town employment opportunities and hires not being representative of the Town's diverse community. He noted that if the matter is not addressed, it will become a larger issue in the near future.

8. New Business

8.1 Tour for Humanity

Chair Harrison provided Members with an overview of the <u>Tour for Humanity</u> event presented by the Simon Weisenthal Center. He noted that the information was very informative and that he would like to strive for all Ajax high schools to participate in the program.

8.2 D-Day 2014

Chair Harrison informed the Committee that Ajax was well represented at Juno Beach for the 70th Anniversary of D-Day and the Battle of Normandy. A tour from Ajax, including many local high school students, was present at the cemetery recognition events with Prime Minister Harper. Ms. Emily Harrison, Youth Engagement Advisory Committee Member was granted the honour of reciting "In Flanders Fields".

8.3 Committee Recognition

On behalf of staff and Council, Ms. Moore presented Members with a certificate and token of appreciation for their contribution and dedication throughout the term. Mr. Karatella and Ms. Jones noted they would not be re-applying for appointment in the new term. On behalf of Members, Chair Harrison thanked staff and Council for their support of the Committee throughout the term.
