1. Call to Order

Chair Haines called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Stu Logan introduced himself to the Committee: roundtable introductions followed.

4. Presentation/Discussion

4.1 Event Partnership Opportunity

E. Leung introduced Liann Yap from Big Brothers Big Sisters Pickering-Ajax. L. Yapp discussed the Sport Mentorship Program being facilitated by Big Brothers Big Sisters Pickering-Ajax, which includes 8-week program opportunities for "Bigs" and their "Littles" to

engage in new sports and recreation opportunities in a small group. The program will run from July 2015 to March 2016. L. Yapp sought feedback from the Committee as to potential activities that could be provided as programming and solicited the Committee's interest in helping to lead a future program or event.

Members proposed activities such as snowshoeing in Greenwood Conservation Area, Geocaching, visiting WindReach Farms, or a Committee-led trail walk. Cycling activities were discussed, however concerns with availability of bicycles, maintenance, storage and transport for all participants were noted. The Committee expressed interest in coordinating an event or activity in partnership with Big Brothers Big Sisters Pickering-Ajax during Bike Month in 2016. L. Yapp was encouraged to consult the Town's Recreation & Culture Advisory Committee and Youth Engagement Advisory Committees for further input.

4.2 Transportation Demand Management Plan

E. Leung provided a summary of the development of the Town's first Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Plan. She asked Members to pay particular attention to Section 8, the plan's Action Plan. Members posed several questions relative to the target audience of the action plan, monitoring and measuring effectiveness. E. Leung noted the plan's objective is to get people to change their mode of transportation, which required education about transportation options. The TDM Plan will incorporate walking, cycling, telecommuting, transit and carpooling options.

Members discussed challenges to residents changing their mode of transportation, noting convenience as a major deterrent. E. Leung facilitated an activity where Members were asked to rank a ballot of TDM Plan Measures from most effective to least effective in encouraging them to change their modes of transportation instead of driving.

C. Antram entered the meeting (6:45 p.m.).

Members shared their top two measures; collectively the following measures where identified to be most effective: promoting rideshare programs to/from the GO Station, introducing a walking school bus program, and undertake small scale-high impact projects.

4.3 Bike Month Competition Update

Members praised Chair Haines for his efforts in acquiring prizes for bike month (dinner vouchers to Mt. Everest Restaurant and a Northern Cycle bike tune-up and water bottle). J. Black was thanked for drafted 50 social media messages to be posted throughout the month of recognition, May 25 – June 25, 2015. Members were encouraged to use the hashtag #ajaxbikemonth. 6. Update from Council

Councillor Crawford provided an update to the Committee on the realignment of Rossland Road at Church Street. She informed the Committee that Council had recently approved its Community Action Plan. Bike Lane installation on Williamson Drive was noted to be on hold as the Town is working with the Region on implementation of audible pedestrian signals and curb work to comply with the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act legislation. Details relative to the forthcoming Public Meeting for the Transportation Demand Management Plan were shared.

7. Standing Items

7.1 Work Plan

No changes were noted.

7.2 Pan Am 2015 Local Host Committee Update

S. Moore shared a summary of recent Local Host Committee activities and several other forthcoming events leading up to and during the Games (Torch Relay, Opening Ceremonies Viewing Party, cultural activations and performances at the Saint Francis Centre, etc.). Members were encouraged to visit www.panamajax.ca to keep apprised of emerging details.

8. New Business

C. Antram provided a summary of the recent Durham Region Transit Advisory Committee meeting she attended, noting details of the recent fare increase and trip announcements. Members inquired about the installation of traffic calming infrastructure on Clements Road West. E. Leung noted that Fire and Emergency Services, as well as Durham Region Transit were consulted on the design of this project and that fire and emergency services vehicles are able to skirt outside of the installed bumps.
