GRIMSBY MUSEUM (6 Murray St.)

Experience some of Grimsby's history at the Grimsby Museum with these free features:

- Grimsby During Wartime exhibit
- Sweat Equity: Grimsby Co-operative Homebuilders 1953—1956 exhibit
- History of Montreal Canadiens' in Grimsby display on the lower level. Come and learn about the rich history of the old Peach King Arena.
- Outdoor, interactive World War 1 re-enactors exhibit with a focus on nursing care during wartime.
- Community Barbeque onsite



Union Lodge #7 (31 Main St. West)

Visit the 6th oldest lodge in Ontario and learn about its history. This location is within the Main St. road closure.

Enjoy an illustrated talk on Grimsby-born Hollywood film director Delbert Lorde at **11:00 am.**

4 Grimsby Art Gallery (18 Carnegie Lane)

Tour the two current exhibits at the Gallery: Southern Ontario Nature and Science Illustrators 2016 Exhibition and Friends of the Greenbelt Photography Display. Guided tours of the back house area and vault will also be



available as well as a feature Doors of Creativity project on display.

5 Grimsby Public Library (18 Carnegie Lane)

Check out the libraries green screen - technology that takes your photo and then you can transpose it on various backgrounds. The libraries innovative 3D printer will also be highlighted today.

At 11 am - hear from award-winning scientist Lucas Penny on harnessing DNA's potential to predict and prevent disease.

Grimsby Fire Department (261 Ontario St.)

The department demonstrates how fire-fighting equipment, from horse-drawn carts and hand pumps to current fire-fighting technology, changes over time. All bays will be open for visitors to view firefighting equipment and fire trucks.

Stop by the Main St. information table for a map of locations, most of which can be reached on foot, by car, by Trolley or by bus shuttle.

7 Nelles Blvd - Shafer Homes (7 and 22 Nelles Blvd)

A unique feature for this year's event. Enjoy guided tours of two homes on Nelles Boulevard that are of the arts and crafts style. These homes were built by the Shafer brothers in the 1940s.

Learn about the Shafer Bros business and the imprint that they have left on Grimsby, and see some of the distinctive homes that still line the streets of Grimsby today.



Objects to Desire (1 Livingston Ave.)





Stop by this downtown landmark built in 1910 that marked a shift in the Grimsby landscape in the 20th century at 1 Livingston Ave.

10 Forty Creek Distillery (297 South Service Rd.)







Tastings and tours of the facility will be available throughout the day.

11 Grimsby Water Treatment Plant (300 North Service Rd)



The Grimsby Water Treatment Plant supplies safe drinking water to Grimsby, Lincoln and West Lincoln. The facility's glass walls allow visitors to view the plant operations.

Tours will be offered hourly from 10 am - 3 pm Closed toe shoes required for the tour.

2 Grimsby Conservation Club (6 Lakeside Dr)

Built in the 1930's, this building was originally Grimsby's water treatment plant. Visit this unique site and learn about the history and future uses of this unique building.

13 Elizabeth Street Pumphouse (477 Elizabeth St.)

The circa 1905 pumphouse will be open and will be featuring an art show presented by the Lakeside Pumphouse Artist Association. The site is also the home of the International Peace Garden



and National Historic Plaque that commemorates the War of 1812 battlefield site. Be sure to stop in for a visit!

14 Community Living (191 South Service Rd.)

Founded in 1965, Community Living is a non-profit organization with the purpose of providing services to people with a developmental disability. Drop by the open house and learn more about their many initiatives, including the Well Preserved product line.

HISTORIC TROLLEY TOURS



One of the best ways to travel around the various Doors Open sites is on the historic trolley. The Trolley will be making a loop that covers many of the sites, complete with guided information along the way. Primary access points for the trolley are the Grimsby Museum or on Main St. Trolley rides are limited to seating capacity and available on a first come, first served basis.
