Joe Isley, Concerns Regarding Speed Limit and Police Presence on Mersea Road 1

Joe Isley, a resident who lives on Mersea Road 1, stated he was in attendance to discuss safety concerns regarding Mersea Road 1.

Mr. Isley explained when County Road 20 became Mersea Road 1 the municipality's Manager of Engineering Services asked Mr. Isley his opinion about the speed limit on the road. Mr. Isley noted he suggested the speed limit be reduced to 40 km/h in the stretch between the East Side Arterial Road and Mersea Road 12 due to the location of Gore Hill Public School. Mr. Isley noted currently the speed limit drops from 80 km/h to 50 km/h just before the school, which does not provide sufficient time for drivers to reduce their speed near the school. Mr. Isley stated many drivers maintain a high vehicle speed in the Gore Hill area despite the speed limit reduction.

Mr. Isley further explained the traffic on Mersea Road 1 has increased significantly over the years due to the construction of the soccer fields and Seaclyff Energy.

Mr. Isley noted his observation that there has been a decrease in police presence since the transition from the Leamington Police Service to O.P.P. and offered the use of his driveway for the officers in order for them to observe speeding cars.

A discussion ensued regarding the doubling of a ticket fine in community safety zones. It was noted school zones are not automatically community safety zones, but rather the Municipality must apply to the Province for the establishment of same.

Mr. Isley noted he informed Tom Bateman of the County of Essex a year ago that the speed limit signs are obstructed. Mr. Isley stated Gore Hill School has a similar number of houses as the area of Paquette Corners, however there is much more police presence in the Paquette Corners area, despite the fact there is a school in the area he is requesting a speed limit reduction.

John Paterson, Chair, informed Mr. Isley the Board does not establish speed limits, but rather can make recommendations to Council regarding speed limits.

Staff Sergeant Beatty noted there have only been four automobile collisions in the area since 2011, three of which were at intersections. He further noted the OPP will take Mr. Isley's comments into consideration and try to increase their presence in the area.

It was noted there is reduced police presence during the months when school is out.

Mr. Isley thanked the Board for allowing him to appear as a delegation and offered to attend a future Council Meeting to express his concerns if needed.

John Paterson, Chair, thanked Mr. Isley for attending the meeting and noted the Board will take Mr. Isley's comments into consideration as safety is of the utmost importance.

A discussion ensued regarding what residents should do when crime occurs in their neighbourhood. Inspector Miller encouraged residents to keep in communication with police in order to receive updates on the status of those who committed the crime.

O.P.P. Community Satisfaction Survey 2014, Essex County Detachment

Staff Sergeant Nyhoff explained the survey is conducted every three years and is for information purposes. He noted there was an increase in satisfaction with the O.P.P. among respondents.

Inspector Miller stated that community safety is of utmost importance and explained the survey results will be reviewed with officers.

Inspector Miller noted the OPP Strategic Plan and Essex County Business Plan will be released in the near future.

Inspector Miller informed the committee he will be attending the West Region Headquarters on August 27th for a briefing on the new OPP billing model.

John Paterson noted he has received complaints about a house on the waterfront that regularly has parties and disturbs the neighbours. He noted the complainant stated they have routinely called the OPP who ask the people to turn the music down, however after the OPP leave the premises, the music is turned up again.

Sergeant Ribble noted he spoke to the neighbours the week before and he will ensure the officers are dispatched whenever a call is received.

There was a discussion regarding Mr. Isley's request for a speed limit reduction in the area of Gore Hill School.

Leamington Overtime Hours

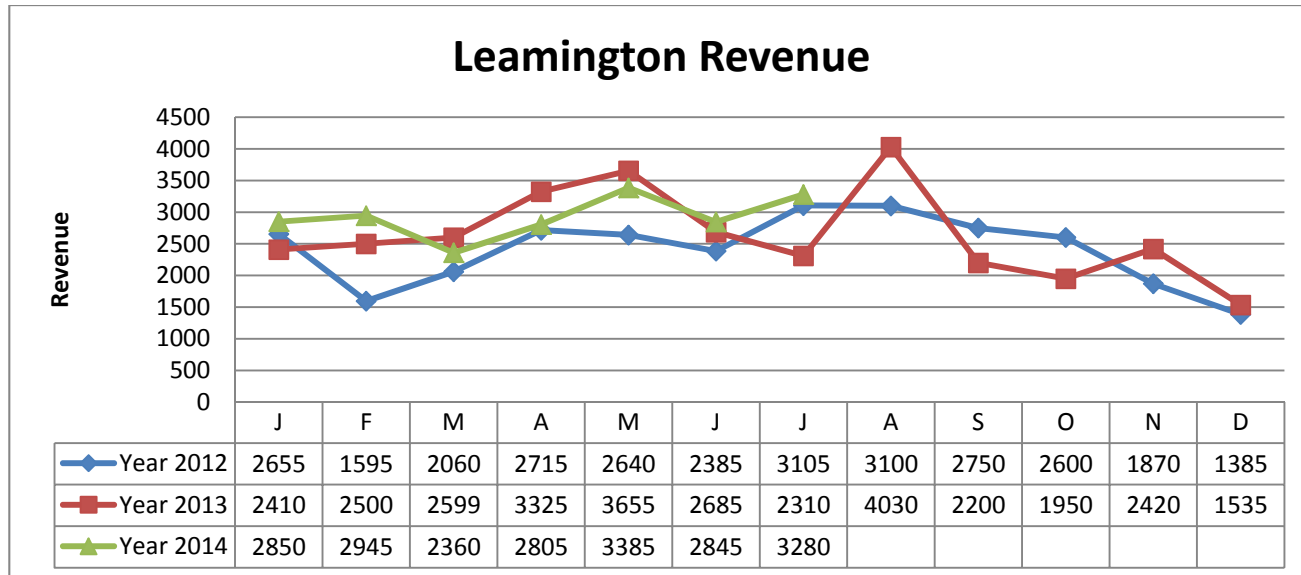
