1. Call to Order

Chair Bowen called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

4. Presentation/Discussion

4.1 HR Services – Town Hall Renovation Project

Ryan Cole, Capital Projects Technologist, reviewed the renovation project planned for the second floor HR Services area of Town Hall. The scope of the project will include security and

access improvements, removal of the wall in the corridor to allow for a customer service counter and glazed partition to be added. The counter height, knee clearance and width were reviewed and in compliance with the Town's Facility Accessibility Design Guidelines. The staff floor plan was also discussed, noting widening of door widths to open the space and repurposing of the door. Members inquired whether the door into the department will have an accessible door operator. R. Cole noted that at this time an accessible door operator is not identified in the budget. Access to the department will require and escort for security purposes.

4.2 Overview of 2015 Accessibility Plan Achievements

- S. Moore noted that she is in the process of collecting submissions from across Town departments for inclusion in the annual status update of the Plan. A more fulsome summary will be provided at the March 23 Meeting. Members provided content to be included from a committee perspective:
 - Accessibility Buzz Newsletter
 - RespectABILITY training
 - Communication Access Canada training
 - Parapan Am Torch Relay
 - National Access Awareness Week initiatives

Members were encouraged to forward additional content via email.

4.3 National Access Awareness Week Event Planning

- S. Moore reviewed the dates confirmed for National Access Awareness Week events:
 - May 16, 2016 Council Proclamation
 - May 27, 2016 Film Screening at St. Francis Centre
 - May 31, 201 Tentative Scout/Guide accessibility presentation
 - June 2, 2016 3rd Annual Accessibility Awareness Night at the Main Branch Library

She informed the Committee that Kyle MacNevin of Wear Your Label is available to attend and speak to the audience following the screening, and possibly with the Town's youth committee. She also noted that the Accessibility Directorate of Ontario is confirmed to take part in the Accessibility Awareness Night event. Members discussed potential organizations to invite to take part in the event. A list will be circulated to Members, along with templates for prize donation requests and invitation letters. Members also requested a calendar be circulated of the important dates and deadlines relative to NAAW. The Committee expressed interest in contacting local scout and guide groups to solicit interest in participating in an accessibility presentation to help earn an accessibility badge. Additional planning and discussion will take place via email and at the March 23, 2016 Meeting.

4.4 Communication Access Canada Module

Members collectively took part in Module 1 of the Communication Access Canada online training and completed the first guiz, scoring 100%.

4.5 March Accessibility Buzz Newsletter

S. Moore reviewed the feedback received from Members for future newsletter content. She noted that the March issue will include information on the new Durham Region Transit Specialized Services Customer Newsletter, senior support programs, an assistive device and AccessON. A draft will be circulated for comment and review.

7.4 Facility Site Audit Project Update

J. Harrison, on behalf of the Facility Audit Project Subcommittee, informed the Committee that with the assistance of K. Smith and H. Steeves, the audit for the Ajax Community Centre has been completed. She provided an overview of observations noting that lack of way-finding is a recurring theme. It was proposed that staff be invited to the Committee to discuss accessibility considerations for the Town's fitness centres and pools. S. Moore noted that she is in the process of coordinating staff to attend a future meeting.

8. New/Other Business

- H. Steeve expressed concerns for the winter maintenance of pedestrian crossings (with specific reference to Kitney & Bayly). She noted ongoing concern for the timing of the light being too short to allow older adults and persons with mobility devices to cross safely. S. Moore noted she would forward comments to the Region and Operations Department for follow-up.
- D. Mullings addressed the Committee and encouraged Members to be mindful of the language they use to discuss disability. She noted the negative connotation associated with the phrase "overcoming" disability and instead encouraged Members to use language that does not individualize disability, but reflects society's collective response to disability.

As the Accessibility Coordinator for the Town of Ajax, I am writing to share comments on the Accessibility Directorate of Ontario's proposed changes to accessibility regulations that were released for public review and comment, extended to March 14, 2016. The Town of Ajax appreciates the leadership that the Directorate has taken in providing a consultative process through this public review, however I would like to propose that in the future, a longer period for public comment submission be considered. There are several approval channels through which comments on behalf of a municipal organization are required to run through, prior to submission, and the limited time frame within which comments are to be submitted, in essence creates a systemic barrier, preventing many organizations from being able to provide formally approved comments.

The Town of Ajax has made great effort to promote a barrier free community for our employees, residents and visitors. Ajax is evolving into a fully inclusive community. Accessible, affordable programs and services, facilities and infrastructure are integral to the economic and social inclusion of people with disabilities. However, these improvements must be made in a sustainable, responsible way which balances the need for accessibility with many other community needs and public priorities. For this reason among others, I am concerned about the approach being taken in the proposed changes to the Accessibility Standards for Customer Service, OR 429/07 and Integrated Accessibility Standards, OR 191/11. I appreciate this opportunity to provide specific comments about the proposed changes.

In summary, I support the overall intent of the proposed changes to OR 191/11, through the revision of its terms to incorporate the Accessibility Standards for Customer Service as a part of the Integrated Accessibility Standards. This realignment, as well as minor amendments proposed to section titles and definitions, will provide for a more comprehensive, harmonized and consistent piece of accessibility legislation. However, there are three priority areas of concern amongst the proposed changes that I would like to acknowledge:

1. Use of Service Animals and Support Persons

- 80.47 (5) The provided may require a person with a disability to be accompanied by a support person when on the premises, but only if, after consulting with the person with a disability and considering the available evidence, the provider determines that,
 - (a) a support person is necessary to protect the health or safety of the person with a disability or he health or safety of other on the premises; and

(b) there is no other reasonable way to protect the health or safety of the person with a disability and the health or safety of others on the premises.

...

(7) If, under subsection (5), the provider requires a person with a disability to be accompanied by a support person when on the premises, the provider shall waive payment of the amount, if any, payable in respect of the support person's admission to the premises or in connection with the support person's presence on the premises.

This section of the proposed changes is quite unclear in identifying who is responsible for providing the support person, if the provider determines one is necessary. Is it the responsibility of the provider or the customer? Separate from an admission amount, if there is a fee for the service of the support person, who is responsible for paying such amount? The provider or the customer? If the onus is on the service provider to provide the support person, this provision could have significant financial impact on municipalities, especially in relation to recreational programming, where the need for additional support persons in the form of inclusion support staff could be determined to be required by the Town as a provider, for such occurrences.

Additionally, subsection (5) refers to 'available evidence'. This term is lacking a definition and a requirement to document such information to provide the customer with notification of the rationale for the provider's determination that a support person is necessary.

2. Exterior paths of travel, accessible pedestrian signals

Where new pedestrian signals are being installed at a pedestrian crossover or existing pedestrian signals are being replaced as a signal-controlled pedestrian crossing, the pedestrian signals must be accessible pedestrian signals.

"pedestrian crossover" means a pedestrian crossover as defined in subsection 1 (1) of the Highway Traffic Act. O. Reg. 413/12, s. 6.

"signal-controlled pedestrian crossing: means and intersection where pedestrian control signals are installed. ("passage pour piétons muni de signaux")

While it is helpful to see clarified language relating to pedestrian crossovers and the newly defined signal-controlled pedestrian crossing, there still remains significant conflict and lacking definitions for the language used in association with determining the location criteria for tactile surface indicators:

Exterior paths of travel, curb ramps

- **80.26** (1) 5. Where the curb ramp is provided at a **pedestrian crossing**, it must have tactile walking surface indicators that,
 - i, have raised tactile profiles,
 - ii. have high tonal contrast with the adjacent surface,
 - iii. are located at the bottom of the curb ramp,
 - iv. are set back between 150 mm and 200 mm from the curb edge,
 - v. extend the full width of the curb ramp, and
 - vi. are a minimum of 610 mm in depth.

There is no definition for the term 'pedestrian crossing' in any part of the regulation, nor in the Highway Traffic Act. Therefore, it is unclear as to whether tactile surface indicators are required where curb ramps are present at 'pedestrian crossovers', at 'signal-controlled pedestrian crossings' or something different altogether. It is disappointing to see that after several requests for clarification on this section have been sent to the Accessibility Directorate of Ontario by municipalities across the province, that no changes to improve interpretation have yet been made. I am proposing that the term 'pedestrian crossing' be removed from Sec. 80.26 (1) and replaced with a clearly defined term.

3. Commencement

Finally, the anticipated July 1, 2016 enactment of the proposed changes amending O. Reg. 191/11 include immediate compliance of the proposed changes. Being that any changes to accessibility legislation trigger required amendments to internal policies, practices and training of employees, et al, which all take time and have processes for approval and implementation, I am requesting that the commencement of the amendment does not take effect until 3-6 months from the date of enactment. Such a time period would provide sufficient opportunities for planning of operational changes and implementation of the new amendments.

The Town of Ajax is strongly committed to improving accessibility within its organization and community. It is believed that removing barriers and building an accessible community improves the quality of life for citizens of all ages and abilities, and we are not alone in that belief. We support ideals and objectives of the AODA and are confident that our shared commitment with Accessibility Directorate of Ontario will ensure a more inclusive, accessible Ontario in the future.

Thank you for the opportunity to submit feedback on proposed changes to accessibility regulations. I trust that these comments and recommendations will be considered and look forward to seeing an approved revised standard that takes a balanced approach to incorporate the feedback received.
