## Minutes of the Kingsville Leamington Animal Control Committee

### Wednesday, January 27, 2016 at 10:00 AM

#### **Disclosures of Pecuniary Interest:**

None noted.

Clerk Brenda Percy called the meeting to order at 9:54 AM and welcomed Committee members.

#### **Election of Chairperson:**

Ms. Percy called for the nominations for the 2016 Chairperson to the Committee.

Moved by: Councillor Wilkinson Seconded by: Councillor Coghill

That John Hammond be appointed as Chairperson of the Kingsville Leamington Municipal Animal Control Advisory Committee for the year 2016.

Carried

Councillor Hammond accepted the nomination of the 2016 Chairperson to the Committee, however, he requested that the Clerk continue to chair the meeting.

#### Adoption of Minutes:

Moved by: Councillor Coghill Seconded by: Councillor McIntyre

That the minutes of the Kingsville Learnington Animal Control Committee meeting held February 25, 2015 be adopted.

#### **Business Arising from the Minutes:**

Councillor Wilkinson explained that he and Councillor Coghill had met with the former Leamington Clerk Brian Sweet regarding the tethering of dogs issue. Councillor Wilkinson advised that he spoke with Ms. Percy and that Leamington is preparing a bylaw to address this issue. Councillor Coghill said Kingsville has a tethering by-law.

Ms. Percy will contact the Windsor Essex Humane Society to confirm that the OSPCA will enforce a provision for tethering within the Animal Control By-law. Ms. Percy said there will be other changes proposed to the Municipality's Animal Control By-law when brought forward to Council.

#### **Business:**

#### Draft Animal Control Budget 2016 and Actuals for 2015:

Ms. Percy noted that the 2016 budget for building insurance has been reduced to zero this is due to the fact that the building is owned by Kingsville and insurance is already paid by Kingsville. The budget still includes liability insurance.

Councillor Coghill asked why the 2015 actuals for revenue were less than the 2015 budget and why is there is a \$40,000 discrepancy. Ms. Percy noted that the Leamington portion may not be allocated to the budget as of yet. Ms. Percy to consult with the Finance Department as why the discrepancy and she will follow-up with the Committee.

Councillor Coghill asked how many years the costs are averaged over. Ms. Percy advised the costs are averaged over a three (3) year period.

Councillor Coghill asked about service contracts and if the amount of \$1,000 is still required when the 2015 year to date was so low. Ms. Percy advised that it may be a decrease, however, she and Director of Legal and Legislative Services Ruth Orton left the proposed budget at \$1,000. If the amount is lower again at the end of 2016, it would be decreased in the 2017 proposed budget.

Councillor Coghill questioned why telecommunications are up 54% from last year. Mr. Wood noted he received a phone last year. Ms. Percy advised that she would confirm with the IT department and report back to the Committee.

It was noted that the \$2,000 for building maintenance is for stone and grading. Mr. Wood confirmed that the painting of the building that was budgeted for in 2015 was completed.

Councillor Coghill noted Kingsville has not budgeted this amount for Joint Animal Control and would be \$1,000 short.

#### Request from Animal Control Officer dated December 9, 2015:

Moved by: Councillor Coghill Seconded by: Councillor Hammond

That the Kingsville Learnington Municipal Animal Control Advisory Committee approve the request from the Animal Control Officer dated December 9, 2015 for a 1% increase to the Kingsville Learnington Animal Control contract.

Re: Animal Control Services Tender

#### **Recommendation:**

It is recommended that:

1. The Kingsville Learnington Municipal Animal Control Advisory Committee direct Administration to prepare and release a tender for Animal Control Services for Learnington and Kingsville.

### **Background:**

For the past thirty years, Larry Wood has been providing animal control services for Leamington. He was initially retained in the position in December of 1986 by the Joint Animal Control Committee comprised of representatives of Mersea Township, the Village of Wheatley, the Township of Gosfield North, the Township of Romney, the Town of Kingsville and the Township of Gosfield South.

Following amalgamation of the area municipalities in 2002, the Municipality of Leamington entered into an agreement with the Town of Kingsville to create a Joint Animal Control Committee comprised of the two municipalities and to set out the terms of joint animal control and the operation of the joint pound facility located in Kingsville.

According to the agreement, the costs of maintaining and operating the facility, including expenses for utilities, minor repairs, insurance, maintenance and replacement of equipment, snow removal, accounting, wages and salaries were apportioned in the amount of 55% for Leamington and 45% for Kingsville. In 2005, the agreement was amended to state that the above noted costs were to be apportioned based upon the average use of each party averaged over the past three years.

Any capital repairs and improvements to the pound are shared equally between Leamington and Kingsville.

In 2002, Learnington and Kingsville entered into an agreement with Larry J. Wood for the provision of animal control services. The specific duties of the Animal Control Officer include:

- a) maintain Pound Facility in a manner acceptable to Kingsville, Leamington and to the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food and Rural Affairs;
- b) to seize and impound every dog found to be running at large within the respective municipalities and to deliver all such dogs to the Pound Facility;
- c) to live trap wildlife, such as raccoons, skunks and possums, on a call out basis only, and to destroy the skunks. Raccoons and possums can be released in more suitable locations or destroyed. Such disposition of raccoons and possums to be at the discretion of the Animal Control Officer.
- d) to remove and dispose of animals found dead on municipal roadways;
- e) to respond to emergency calls from local police forces, relating to animal control;
- f) to furnish each dog so impounded with good and sufficient food and water daily and shelter during the whole time that it continues to be impounded;
- g) to restore possession of the dog to the owner where:
  - (i) the owner claims and takes possession of the dog within the redemption period, and;
  - (ii) the owner pays to the Animal Control Officer a reclaiming and/or poundage fee as established by the Joint Municipal Animal Control Committee; and.
  - (iii) the owner produces a valid dog tag for the current year from the appropriate Municipality;
- h) if at the end of the 72 hour redemption period, possession of the dog has not been restored to the owner pursuant to the paragraph (g) above, then the Animal Control Officer may sell the dog pursuant to the Adoption Policy as established by Kingsville and Leamington.
- i) if the dog is not adopted, in accordance with the adoption policy, then the Animal Control Officer may destroy the dog in a humane manner and dispose of it at an approved manner.
- j) if a dog seized should, in the opinion of the Animal Control Officer, be destroyed without delay because of concerns for safety or reasons of humanity, the Animal Control Officer may immediately destroy the dog in a humane manner;
- all female dogs found running at large and in heat and subsequently seized and impounded shall be confined within an enclosed building separate from other impounded dogs;
- the Animal Control Officer shall file with the Clerk of each respective municipality on a monthly basis, a statement or report indicating:
  - (i) the number of dogs impounded;
  - (ii) the number of dogs adopted and amounts received;
  - (iii) the number of dogs euthanized or otherwise disposed of;
  - (iv) the number of wildlife picked up and destroyed.

According to the agreement, the Animal Control Officer submits all reclaim fees to the appropriate municipalities on a monthly basis at a rate to be set by the Kingsville Leamington Municipal Animal Control Committee. Further, the Animal Control officer submits all adoption fees to the appropriate municipality on a monthly basis.

The contract with Mr. Wood has remained in effect since 2002, generally with incremental annual increases in the contract fee. In 2015, the yearly contract fee for the Animal Control Officer was \$83,698.69 plus HST. The cost of wildlife pick-up is in addition to this fee. Payment for the first call for wildlife pickup is \$70.00 being \$35.00 for the trap and \$35.00 for the pick-up and is one-half of that amount for the second and all future calls within a calendar year. The agreement may be terminated by any of the parties on 90 days' notice.

#### Comments:

It is important to note that Mr. Wood has provided a good service and this report is not due to any concern in relation to the services provided, however, it has been 15 years since the animal control services contract has been reviewed. In order to ensure that the Municipality of Leamington and Municipality of Kingsville are receiving the best service for the best price, it is recommended a tender be released for the provision of animal control services.

The successful tender will be presented to this Committee for its recommendation to each municipality's Council for review and acceptance.

#### Financial Impact:

The draft budget includes funds for the estimated cost of this contracted service.
