5.1 Coordinator of Arts & Culture Report

5.1.1 Collins Hall Retrofit Update

- The puppeteers shows on Friday & Sunday highlighted that the stage at Collins Hall has accessibility issues. A handilift is being added to the budget request for retrofitting the Collins Hall.
- Currently renting lighting /pipe & draping, which is working well.
- Now in the process of sourcing options to purchase this equipment.
- Seat will now be numbered
- Parents for Dance Show was a great success, but highlighted the lack of proper dressing room space for artists.
- Options are now being explored to remedy this situation.

5.2 CAO - Daniel Gagnon presented by T. Turner

5.2.1 Update on Civic Centre building condition

Civic Centre:

- Basement spaces gutted down to the studs, more heat added to prevent mould, etc.
- Insurance engineer applying for demolition permit now and lining up equipment for the removal of trusses, HVAC unit salvage and partial demolition

- Engineer is recommending the theatre can be rebuilt and the building salvaged
- Talking to Hydro One about reinstalling some hydro to minimize use of generators and temporary heaters

Hub:

- Received some general tips on funding application garnered in meeting with Min of Infrastructure bureaucrats in Toronto.
- They will be looking for:
 - o value for money. Economies of scale
 - o as many services as possible for the lowest possible cost
 - o they will want to see regional partners and catchment areas
 - they will evaluate our ability to pay and the per capita household income indicators etc.
- Deadline is a little longer than originally thought. The funding criteria will be announced in late summer and deadline to apply 8 or so weeks after that, so deep into the fall. That said, funding announced quickly after that and eligible construction can start 2020
- As the funding criteria gets closer to finalized we will stay in touch with bureaucrats and they can give updates in the summer.
- Pre-fab building components will be open tender
- Will get a summer student to research the size of projects that municipalities our size got in 2009-11 Building Canada Fund days (the last time fed/prov/mun cost sharing was done for large rec facilities). Could be useful to glean what the magic number could be for municipalities our size.

To clarify a couple of things:

- The engineer is not recommending anything. He's just saying the theatre wing and the building can be salvaged if we want it to.
- We still don't know if we want it to or not and won't be able to make that call till we have more info

- Former school on Lisbon Road's interior was damaged and likely needs a lot of work following a fire in 2017
